All suppliers involved in tenders for new pieces of work, regardless of being the selected supplier or not, are aware of our ethical requirements.

We recognise the importance of maintaining constant vigilance to identify and address any issues associated with slavery and human trafficking in our company and throughout our supply chains. We are committed to continuing to enhance our capacity to identify, prevent and mitigate any actual or potential risks in these areas. This includes communications through various channels to staff and also the ability to report concerns through our Serious Concerns & Whistleblowing process.
